Detailed Itinerary

Day 01 (05th May) :- Leh

Arrival in Leh, check-in at hotel for acclimatization with dinner and overnight stay. Ready for a great trip!

Day 02 (06th May) :- Leh Exploration

A day to relax in Leh and acclimatize yourself. After breakfast drive to explore the beauty of Shanti Stupa, Leh palace, Thiksey Monastry and market . Shanti Stupa:- Shanti stupa was founded in 1985 sponsored by Japanese for world peace. It was inaugurated by His holiness the 14th Dalai lama. Shanti stupa has a spectacular view of Leh city and Stok glacier.

Leh Palace:-The Leh Palace known as 'Lachen Palkhar' was built by Singay Namgyal, around the beginning of 17th century AD. The nine-storey Palace is now deserted, and archeological survey of India has taken up the renovation work. Overnight in hotel.

Visit The Hall of Fame and if you wish to see the lights show in the evening your free to stay back and see the show. A place that shows how Indian Army fought with its Martyrs and Arms used during the Indo-Pak war. It also has a small souvenir store

DAY 03 (07TH May) :- Leh To Nubra Valley Via Khardung La Pass 17,582 FT., Distance: 120 Kms

After breakfast, we drive to Nubra valley. The journey from Leh to Nubra spans 39 km and passes through the iconic Khardung La Pass. At an altitude of 17,582 ft., it is one of the five highest motorable roads in the world. Shrouded in a blanket of snow, the pass affords you sweeping views of the Indus Valley, along with the seemingly endless Zanskar range in the south. To your north, behold the magnificent Saser massif in all its glory.

Adorned with fluttering prayer flags, Khardung La top is arguably the most picturesque location in Ladakh. From Khardung La, we continue the journey to Nubra valley, also known as Ldumra or the Valley of Flowers. Sitting at an altitude of approximately 10,000 ft., it is nestled in the north of Ladakh, right between the Ladakh Himalayas and the Karakoram range. Once at Nubra, we check into our camps/hotel in Hunder for the night. Take in the breathtaking views of the lush oasis villages set as a stark contrast amidst barren mountains. These villages give you a rare glimpse into the fascinating lives of the locals. Overnight stay at the camp/hotel.

Day 04 (08th May) :- Nubra to Turtuk to Nubra, Distance: 250 kms

After an early breakfast, we head out from the camp/hotel, and drive to Turtuk Via Shyok War memorial, Turtuk is a village in the Indian union territory of Ladakh and the headquarters of an eponymous community development block. Turtuk is one of the northernmost villages of India, second only to Murgo Village, the northernmost village of India. Also known as the last village of India.

Day 05 (09th May) : Nubra to Pangong Tso, Distance: 240 kms

Reigning at an altitude of 13,930 ft., the alpine lake of Pangong spans about 5 - 8 km in width and 140 km in length, sharing territory with India (30%) and China (70%). Catch the slanting rays of the sun on the bright, crystal-clear waters of the lake, which also bears beautiful reflections of the barren hills that guard it. Throughout the day, catch the shuttle change in the colors of the lake - from clear blue to dark green to turquoise and more. The entire setting could not be more perfect. Overnight stay at the hotel.

DAY 06 (10th May) :- Pangong Tso To Leh Via Chang La Pass, Distance: 225 Kms

After an early breakfast, we drive back to Leh via Chang La Pass, another one of the world's highest motorable roads (17,586 ft.) A scenic 8 hours drive brings you to the top of Chang La Pass, a perfect spot for photography. From Chang La Pass, we head down to Leh.

Day 07 (11th May) :- Back to Leh Post breakfast we check out from the hotel and proceed towards Airport.

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Apart from above in some cases like Special Train Journeys, hotels or resorts bookings during the peak season (X-Mas, New Year), full payment is required to be sent in advance.

Mode of Payment: Overseas advance payment can be made through Wire Transfer to our bank.

Cancellation Policy:

In the event of cancellation of tour / travel services due to any avoidable / unavoidable reason/s we must be notified of the same in writing. Cancellation charges will be effective from the date we receive advice in writing, and cancellation charges would be as follows:

30 days prior to travel: 25% of the Tour / service cost 29 - 20 days prior to travel: 50% of the Tour / service cost Less than 19 days prior to travel: 100% of the Tour / service cost 72 hours prior to travel OR No Show: No Refund

Note: Written cancellation will accept on all working days, except Sunday, Any cancellation sent on Sunday will be considered on next working day (Monday).

For the X-mas and New Year period from 20 Dec to 05 Jan the payment is non-refundable. In case you cancel the trip after commencement, refund would be restricted to a limited amount only which too would depend on the amount that we would be able to recover from the hoteliers/ contractors we patronize. For unused hotel accommodation, chartered transportation & missed meals etc. we do not bear any responsibility to refund.

Wildlife Safaris cancellation: All the wildlife safaris booked into any of Indian Wildlife National Park/Sanctuaries are non-refundable. Even date change request will be Considered as cancellation and no payment will be refunded/ adjusted against it.
